The Pauline Redmond Coggs Foundation, Incorporated, was established in 1999 by Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, Epsilon Kappa Omega Chapter, for charitable, educational and community services.



It serves as a vehicle for accepting, raising, distributing and investing funds for scholarships and awards to students; to establish on-going educational programs and for charitable donations and community projects which assist mankind in general. The Foundation targets the following areas: education, health, the black family, economic empowerment, arts



and leadership development. The Foundation is named after Pauline Redmond Coggs, who was the first African-American woman to head the Urban League in Washington, D.C. She passed away in 2005 at the age of 93.
