As Chair of the County Board's Committee on Finance and Audit, I am delighted to say that Wednesday night's public hearing on the 2009 County Budget was a resounding success.

"A number of our constituents thanked us for choosing Franklin as the first of four sites for these meetings," Supervisor Coggs said. "They appreciate the opportunity to participate in the democratic process. It's important for them to have a say early on, before the County Executive presents his budget to the County Board. My colleagues and I will consider their input during the budget process this fall."

Both Supervisors who represent the Franklin area joined supervisor Coggs at the public hearing: Mark Borkowski, who welcomed the Committee to Franklin City Hall, and Paul Cesarz. Supervisors John F. Weishan, Jr., Willie Johnson, Jr., and Johnny L. Thomas were also on hand to listen to constituent concerns.
